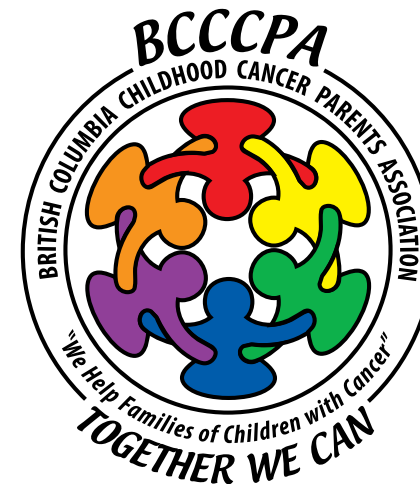

The British Columbia Childhood Cancer Parents' Association (**BCCCPA**) was formed in 2002 by parents of children with cancer. We are a registered non-profit society of volunteers.

One of our main goals is to help families who are struggling with the financial burden of taking care of their child with cancer or a blood disorder by providing them with financial aide through the social workers at their hospital.

Childhood cancer knows no social or economic boundaries, and can be financially devastating for many families.

At any given time more than 350 children are in active cancer treatment at B.C. Children's Hospital. As many as 1,500 children are also being followed as out-patients on a long term basis.



## Examples of financial strain families face who have a child with cancer

- **Travel Costs**

B.C. Children's Hospital provides specialized cancer treatment for children from all over B.C. More than 45% of families come from outside the Lower Mainland, and transportation and accommodation costs are a significant challenge for families through long periods of treatment.

- **Loss of Income**

One parent must stay with their child throughout their hospital stay and during subsequent treatment, which may last months or years, resulting in loss of family income.

- **Child Care**

Families have to provide child care for siblings at home while at the hospital with their sick child.

- **Medication**

Out-patient pharmacy bills and feeding supplements can be hundreds of dollars a week, only some of which is covered by Pharmacare or extended health plans. Also, many people are self-employed and have no extended health benefits.

- **Treatment Outside Canada**

Some children face the prospect of receiving cancer therapy in the United States. The cost of a two or three month stay in the U.S. is expensive and unsettling.
